* Lela's father, Jessie McFarland, had a McFarland stepfather, but his biological father's name was Moles.

ADDITIONAL NOTES: The Norwegian family branches have a history of name changes. One of the prominent old names is Bøen (now Bøhn) which is pre-Klemmetsrud (Klemesrud). From 1862 to 1866 Knud Klemesrud lived on the Ildjarnstadhaugen farm and went by that name. In Norway, Norby was spelled Nordby. One of the Grøv family lines is about 0.0003% Scottish, not even enough to alter the numbers above. My Irish McCormick great-great-grandfather had an English mother. The Lipe branch of the family is mostly German but traces back to the Leipp family of Switzerland. Moles is a Scottish name but that clan stems from Molesworth in England. Johanna Wetzel's maiden name was Haise. She may have been unofficially adopted by the Ball family that founded the town of Ballwin, Missouri. The Ball family was Irish, but census records and her death certificate show that she was German.

ENGLAND East Midlands	8%	12.5%	Even though records show that Lela's father, Jessie Moles, claimed to be Scottish. He must have been more English. The Moles paternal line comes from a place right on the Scottish/English border with a family connection to Molesworth, England.
CELTIC & GAELIC - Central Scotland & Northern Ireland - Connacht, Ireland - Donegal, Ireland	2% 2% 1%	9.375% Irish	It's estimated that Lela was 37.5% Irish from the Brady and McCormick family lines.
CENTRAL & EASTERN EUROPE Eastern Czechia	3%	0%	Unknown origin. Likely connection with German lines.
EASTERN MEDITERRANEAN Cyprus	1%	0%	Near Turkey and Lebanon. Unknown origin. Possibly due to maritime trade networks of the Mediterranean.
SOUTHEASTERN EUROPE Ionian Islands	1%	0%	Part of Greece. Unknown origin. Possibly due to maritime trade networks of the Mediterranean.

Note that siblings can have different DNA ethnicity test results depending on whom they take after.
